2017 YCW Summer Jobs

The employers' deadline to submit a summer job application was February 1st, and we received 115 applications for a total of 127 jobs in the archival field, and 126 applications for a total of 183 jobs in the library field. As in previous years, CCA obtained the assistance of independent judges to evaluate the applications. The evaluation process will take place during the month of March, and we hope to notify the employers of the results of the selection process at the beginning of April via their online account on the YCW website.

National, Provincial and Territorial Archivists Conference (NPTAC)

Declaration on guiding principles relating to the acquisition of private-sector archival records In June 2016, members of the National, Provincial and Territorial Archivists Conference (NPTAC) agreed to a declaration on guiding principles relating to the acquisition of private-sector archival records. This declaration is now available on LAC's website in both official languages:

The NPTAC's vision for collaborative acquisition involves all members of the Canadian archival community at the national, provincial and territorial levels working co-operatively to acquire archival material in a manner that effectively preserves and facilitates public access to Canada's documentary heritage.

NPTAC is a long-standing consultative body comprised of the heads of the 13 provincial and territorial archives, and the Librarian and Archivist of Canada. Meeting twice-yearly within a federal-provincial-territorial framework, NPTAC facilitates broad discussion on matters of mutual interest, and undertakes small collaborative projects that support specific goals and objectives of the Canadian Archival System.
